Her career started with First Federal Savings, Jackson, where she was part of the team that processed the first GI Loan in the state of Mississippi. In 1947 Velma married the love of her life, L.E. McCoy, and they shared 64 years together before his passing in 2012. After having children, Velma started a second career with the US Postal Service, working the front counter at the Terry PO. She enjoyed this job because she was able to see and talk with many of the townsfolk during the day. A long-time member of First Baptist Church, Terry, she taught children's Sunday School classes for many years. Velma loved gardening, cooking, keeping current on news and fashion, and family gatherings. She cherished her family, friends, and church. Spending time with those she loved was always a priority.
